Hey CrossRoads Family!

As the section in our hymnal on the passion and death of Christ implies, we are going darker this week with Hymn #290 "Go to Dark Gethsemane." If you aren't familiar with that big, weird word, that is ok! It is the name for the garden in Jerusalem that the Gospels tell us Jesus took his disciples to the night he was arrested.

In the garden, Jesus prayed to God to let this coming fate pass before him if possible, but he also prayed that God's will be done, not his own. As Jesus finishes this prayer, the one who betrayed him approached with the soldiers who would arrest him and take him away to be condemned, and we see that even Jesus' requests do not always get answered how even he would have hoped for. But not in vain - because God was at work in other ways.

The garden was a place of deep agony for our fully human, fully divine Christ. There he teaches us that we can bring all our pain before God, but he also moves our view to see that sometimes we don't get the answers we wish for because God has a bigger picture playing out for us.

That is what I think we are meant to get from these words written by James Montgomery in 1820.

Go to dark Gethsemane, ye that feel the tempter's power; your Redeemer's conflict see, watch with him one bitter hour. Turn not from his griefs away; learn of Jesus Christ to pray. See him at the judgment hall, beaten bound, reviled, arraigned; O the wormwood and the gall! O the pangs his soul sustained! Shun not suffering, shame, or loss; learn of Christ to bear the cross. Calvary's mournful mountain climb; there, adoring at his feet, mark that miracle of time, God's own sacrifice complete. "It is finished!" hear him cry; learn of Jesus Christ to die. Early hasten to the tomb where they laid his breathless clay; all is solitude and gloom. Who has taken him away? Christ is risen! He meets our eyes; Savior, teach us so to rise.

Although we are bid to come to the garden, Montgomery does not leave us in Gethsemane. Instead, he walks us all the way to the garden where the tomb will be found empty.

That is what God does when we come with our requests from our own agonies. We pray in the garden, but we are never left there. Even when our answers don't seem to come. God is moving us to a new garden still. One where we are taught that we have the power to rise as Christ did, and where we see that the agony was never going to be our end.

May we ponder that as our Lenten journey continues.
