Hey CrossRoads Family!

This coming Sunday is Palm Sunday, when we remember that moment that Jesus enters Jerusalem, where his whole earthly ministry journey had been directing him. Where he entered the city with praises from the people and yet would end the week with shouts of condemnation from some of the same people.

This week's hymn is one I am almost certain none of you have ever heard in a worship service because the English translation is not the original version. I am going to share the English translation with you all, but I encourage you to look this one up in your hymnal to see it in both languages.

This is Hymn #279 "Mantos y Palmas (Filled with Excitement)" and it was written by Ruben Ruiz Avila in 1972 and translated by Gertrude Suppe in 1979.

Filled with excitement, all the happy throng spread cloaks and branches on the city streets. There in the distance they begin to see, riding on a donkey, comes the Son of God. From every corner a thousand voices sing praises to him who comes in the name of God. With one great shout of acclamation loud triumphant song breaks forth: "Hosanna, hosanna to the King! Hosanna, hosanna to the King!"

As in that entrance to Jerusalem, we sing hosannas to the Christ, our King, to the living Savior who still calls today, asking us to follow him with love and faith. From every corner a thousand voices sing praises to him who comes in the name of God. With one great shout of acclamation loud triumphant song breaks forth: "Hosanna, hosanna to the King! Hosanna, hosanna to the King!"

This is how we will begin our worship together Sunday as we remember this excited moment of shouts and praise! Come ready to wave a palm branch high and as excitedly as you can muster!

Palm Sunday starts the holy week off with praise, but it ends with our attention turning towards the cross. So as we begin with palm branches waving, we must end the service by dropping them and trampling over them on the way out the door as we prepare our hearts for the week.

As we prepare ourselves for this heavy Sunday, I pray you will ponder what it might have been like to be a part of those shouting hosanna as Jesus entered the city. Could we duplicate their excitement Sunday as we shout our own hosannas?

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'" They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people lef them go. When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!" "Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple courts. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.


