Lenten season. **This is Maundy Thursday**. Maundy comes from a Latin word meaning commandment. Read these Scripture verses with me and see if you can determine why this day is called "Maundy Thursday." John 13:1-5, 12-15, 34-35

Before the Festival of Passover, Jesus knew that his time had come to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the

world, he loved them fully. Jesus and his disciples were sharing the evening meal. The devil had already provoked Judas, Simon Iscariot's son, to betray

Jesus. Jesus knew the Father had given everything into his hands and that he had come from God and was returning to God. So he got up from the table and took off his robes. Picking up a linen towel, he tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a washbasin and began to wash the disciples' feet, drying them with the towel he was wearing. After he washed the disciples' feet, he put on his robes and returned to his place at the table. He said to them, "Do you know what I've done for you? You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and you speak correctly, because I am. If I, your Lord and teacher, have washed your feet, you too must wash each other's feet. I have given you an example: Just as I have done, you also must do. "I give you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you also must love each other. This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other."

Love others because you are loved by me, and when you show this love people will come to know me. Love others by putting them before yourself. Love others by caring for them. Love others by meeting their needs and doing generous things for them. Do you remember how our Lenten season started on Ash Wednesday which

we began this season on the day we use to tell people that we love them. And now our season is wrapping up with Holy Week and we are yet again

How many times have you touched a towel today? Maybe it was in the bathroom this morning or in the kitchen during lunch or in your laundry pile

that you attempted to move or fold. I bet you've touched at least towel today of some kind. I bet your house is full of different sized towels!

I hope that our everyday item for Maundy Thursday's message becomes a reminder to us. May the towels you encounter remind you of the command to love as you have been loved. May you be willing to wash someone else's feet this week. Peace and Blessings,
